Lochvaal Emfuleni Welfare and Family Care is a place of safety for hunger, neglected abused children, women, single mothers and rejected elderly people. We approach you in humility for financial assistance for our dare to care Christmas Project. Our financial and food reserves are critically low. With the poor economic situation in the Vaal Triangle, we feed and care for 141 people, including 38 children per day with 3 meals daily (400-430 meals per day) and a warm bed to sleep in. With Christmas approaching, we receive people who cannot be turned away, daily. We especially want the kids to experience the joy of Christmas. A nice meal and to receive a present. They have so little in life but we want them to have a special joyous Christmas. Are you willing to make a dream come true? We are a non-profit welfare organization that receives no financial assistance from the Government and is solely dependent on donors like you. It is only with the help of individuals and the private sector that we can provide the basic care that every person deserves. The basic services are as follows: Life Skills, Counselling, Improving Quality of Life, Supporting Systems, Preventing and Treating Diseases with transport to and from clinics and hospitals, Hygiene, Clothing Washing, Nursery Training, Aftercare Centre and Training sessions, Development and Empowerment to the poor.

Our Passion:

It is the Lochvaal Emfuleni Welfare's passion to ensure the optimal development of traumatized, needy babies, children, adults and the elderly, to develop and empower their residential, physical and spiritual well-being. We try and bring together disrupted and rejected children and families until they can function independently and contribute to society.

Our Vision:

We are a Christian educational organization and strive to improve quality life with safety, love and skills of learners, despite their lack of talents or shortcomings.

Our Mission:

Providing learning programs that will improve the development of learners in all life skills.

Our Goal:

To apply discipline, to develop compassionate and socially well-adjusted children and full-grown young adults, as young leaders.

Upliftment Projects:

Our projects currently being practiced to empower and reintegrate adult people are as follows:

Vegetable Project:

Residents maintain the existing vegetable-growing tunnel, which is also used every day for a nutritious cooked meal and delicious soup vegetables. The project develops, motivates and teaches residents how to grow vegetables, pest and pest control, harvest, and how to preserve vegetables.

Pallet Woodwork Project:

Male residents specializing in woodworking design and manufacturing of wood furniture, cabinets, tables and chairs, etc., lead others to be carpenters. Furniture restoration is also done. Wood baskets are made in which ladies then make bouquets from paper roses, all the handmade articles are then sold, and the revenue is used to help with the day to day costs

Camp Cooker Drum" Project:

Portable stoves, which are made by our men who have boiler makers experience, from old 210 liter oil drums in which wood is fired. The food is then cooked on it and used daily, saving us electricity.

Women's Crafts Project:

Ladies make paper bouquets and gifts for different occasions like Mother's Day, Father's Day and Valentine's Day etc.

"Clothe the poor" Project:

All clothes and shoes collected from donations from churches, schools and the public are distributed among the residents.

Education Project:

The nursery school on the premises teaches the children, gives parenting classes and preschool is done Brain Gym. As part of our aftercare we have a teacher who helps the pupils with homework.

"Health comes first" Project:

Mobile health services, clinics and medical services are offered. We transport people to and from various clinics and hospitals. Where the following are presented: Prevention and Treatment of HIV and Tuberculosis, Inoculation of Children, Hygiene and Support Groups. Doctor visits for the elderly who are on chronic medication and dental services are scheduled.

NA Anonymous":

A support group is available on a weekly basis. Every Friday evening for people who have a drug and drink problem, are supported and guided, and thus become psychologically and spiritually built.

Spiritual guidance:

We are in a privileged position to have a resident pastor on the premises. Tuesdays mornings a women's prayer service is offered and Tuesdays and Wednesdays evenings, evening services are held, men's evening services on Thursday evenings and Sundays our main services. The organization is very much committed to Christian values and we strive for it.

With faith, prayers and confidence in our hearts, we ask you to help us make a difference in the lives of 141 poor, hungry, vulnerable children, abusive mothers, rejected elderly, and needy families.
